Dove Creek Equine Rescue Located in West TX Achieves GFAS Accreditation



March 16, 2023 (Canyon, TX) – The Global Federation of Animal Sanctuaries (GFAS), the only globally recognized organization providing standards for identifying legitimate animal sanctuaries, awarded Accredited status to Dove Creek Equine Rescue (DCER) as of March 6, 2023.

Dove Creek Equine Rescue first achieved GFAS Verification in April of 2018, meeting criteria for providing humane and responsible care to equines. With dedication and commitment to demonstrating high levels of professionalism, Dove Creek Equine Rescue has now achieved Accredited status. Accreditation signifies that DCER meets GFAS's rigorous and peer-reviewed equine care standards which are confirmed by a comprehensive site visit. Accreditation also signifies adherence to standards addressing the sustainability of the organization, ethical principles, finances, staffing, education outreach, security and safety and other operational aspects. The Accreditation status also provides a clear and trusted means for the public, donors, and grantors to recognize Dove Creek Equine Rescue as an exceptional organization.

We honor and value the horse/human bond and offer various opportunities to nurture that bond through our Volunteer and Equine Assisted Learning and Coaching programs. Since 2012, we have re-homed 75 percent of the 250 + horses received while maintaining the other 25 percent that are not adoptable in our sanctuary, thanks to the generosity of our supporters. By only rehoming horses that we feel have had time to fully rehabilitate we ensure a successful adoption. An average of 30 horses at Dove Creek enjoy 500 acres of grassy plains where they roam in a "herd" environment, setting the stage for the continued healing of their minds and bodies. It is this unparalleled environment and painstaking care provided by our staff and volunteer team that enable us to successfully rehabilitate and rehome these wonderful majestic creatures.
